
Transit Plan Kickoff



The Division of Statewide Planning, RIPTA and RIDOT held a kickoff meeting on May 9 to launch the State's first Transit Plan. The plan is an ambitious effort to guide future policy for public transportation mods (bus, rail, and ferry) in Rhode Island. The State has secured the services of renowned transit planning firm Nelson/Nygaard to draft the plan, which is expected to take approximately eighteen months to complete. The Plan will involve extensive outreach efforts aimed at both traditional stakeholder groups and the broader transit-using public. The end result of the effort will form a cohesive vision for the future of transportation in Rhode Island, alongside the Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) and the Bicycle Mobility Plan, two plans that are already underway.

TOD Planning Continues

The Rhode Island Transit Oriented Development (TOD) Working Group had its second meeting on April 19. The group- made up of municipal planners, State agencies, and transit providers- is tasked with assisting the Division of Planning with the creation of tools to make transit oriented development simpler and more attractive to developers in Rhode Island. The group is assisting the Division with: the creation of an interactive, web-based map; model ordinances for urban and suburban contexts; and potentially creating a Statewide program to designate "official" TODs. In addition to the working group, the



Division of Planning is arranging for a field trip to Canton, MA to explore real-world transit oriented development around the town's "T" station. The Division is also working with Grow Smart RI on the creation of a Transit Oriented Development land use training aimed at local planners and planning/zoning boards. May 11 Deadline for <u>NRCS/RI Conservation Conservation Innovation Grant</u>. This program will to stimulate the development and adoption of innovative conservation approaches and technologies. Applications will be accepted from eligible entities for projects carried out in the state of Rhode Island. Projects may be between one and three years in duration. The maximum award amount for a single award in FY 2018 is \$75,000.
